Dear Parents and Carers,

My grateful thanks to those staff who supported a number of our youngsters who went to Young Voices at the O2 last week. They were treated like royalty as they were allowed to relax in a VIP box in between practices. All had a great time and I know parents who attended were very proud – a late night all round though! I am aware over the past couple of weeks a number of our year 6 pupils had their EHCPs finalised and sent to parents, naming the child's secondary school for September 2020. In some cases I understand the covering letter has stated Chiltern Wood as the named school, even though section I lists another school for the September 2020 placement. The Local Authority have asked us to pass on that the covering letter automatically generates the name of the child's existing school, and that this should be ignored. The vital information is contained in the EHCP itself, which should list the correct school in section I. There are some pupils for whom the authority is still finalising the secondary place, so please do not panic if this is the case. Please be aware the LA is the decision maker as far as placements are concerned, but it is always a good idea to keep us informed and we will help where we can.

Kathryn Edwards from Squirrel class is planning to leave us at Easter time as she is expecting a baby! Jane Robb will take over as the class teacher, and Jane is spending time in the class already getting to know the pupils and routines. It was great to see so many of you last night and over the course of the week; enjoy the half term break and we look forward to seeing pupils return on Monday 24th February.
