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Dear Parents and Carers,

Another year has passed, and it's hard to accurately reflect the range of challenges that we have all faced and overcome. It is a big understatement to say we all deserve a big pat on the back. Sadly we have been reacting to a number of Covid related issues this past two weeks, with staffing levels affected by isolation requirements, and then we have had 3 positive cases amongst our secondary provision too. It is highly disruptive and I can only apologise that we have not finished the year as smoothly as we would like. I am intentionally not communicating the details of how we will operate in the new year, as I am keen to digest the guidance fully and see what the national picture is like towards the end of August.
