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Dear Parents and Carers,

A super busy start to the half term and lots to fit in! Drop off and collection at both our sites always causes congestion and I know it has been quite challenging for all concerned over the course of this week. However, everyone is getting used to a new routine and changes to transport amongst other things. Thank you so much to the vast majority of parents who work so collaboratively with us, with compassion and understanding that we are all working to the same goal. There have been a couple of incidents this week where parents have been highly disrespectful to staff. We all acknowledge the stresses of time constraints at either end of the school day, but please remember that our staff do not deserve to be on the receiving end of abusive language and behaviour, and it won't be tolerated. We strive hard to build excellent relationships with you all as parents, and I am indebted to the overwhelming majority of parents who work with us collaboratively. We have tried to iron out some of the issues that were in evidence earlier in the week, and hopefully we are now on top of them.

Vaccinations have been at the forefront of my attention this week with flu vaccines for years 7-11 due to roll out in the coming week (Tuesday) and Covid vaccines for 12-15 year olds getting approved. This will be carried out in school before half term, with more information to follow. Consent is required for any vaccination, via the online portal and letter which will come out in due course. Please get in touch if you have any concerns about these.

On a related theme with regards to Covid, we have had a total of two confirmed (unrelated) cases amongst staff over the past 2 weeks. As I have outlined previously, there is now no further action due unless NHS Track and Trace deem it necessary. I think it's helpful to acknowledge this takes some getting used to, as we are more familiar with rules requiring isolation regarding close contacts of a confirmed case.

Some staff news – Michael Bown, who is a senior support assistant in Topaz class on the Downley site, has completed his degree, and succeeded in getting a first! His aim is to become a teacher, and we hope to support him in that in the future. The Local Authority have done a lot of work on the Local Offer recently, and have urged all special schools to remind parents of its existence. My feeling is that generally it is not well used, but it can be a source of excellent information for all things SEND.
