So how do I become a Parent Governor?

Parent Governors are directly elected by the parents at our school.

- Nominate yourself as a candidate by completing the slip at the bottom of the accompanying letter.
- If there is only one parent nominated, they will be elected unopposed, but if there are more candidates, a postal ballot will be held with all parents able to vote.
- The name of the successful candidate will be made available as soon as the appointment has been finalised.

- 1 Staff Governor
- 1 Head Teacher
