Parent Ambassador Update

As the term draws to a close, I have been working on next term's training and events. We have a variety of dates for your diaries - do check out our spring calendar and the posters on the next slides.

I can highly recommend the When Dreams Change course, which I am running in January. I have found it really useful in getting my head round my child's diagnosis. Often when a child is diagnosed, the parent goes into fix mode and trying to find out all they can about supporting their child with their additional needs. The parents emotions around their child's diagnosis are often ignored in the busyness of parenting their child. This course allows you to take the time out for yourself and to give you the chance to grieve the lost expectations for your life and to remember that you are important too. On the course we look at:

emotions you may feel around your child's diagnosis

the changes you have to make for your child and how this affects you and your expectations of life your identity and looking after yourself

building a better support network

dropping the mask and being real with your support network about the difficulties and reality of parenting a child with additional needs

and goals for the future

It can also be a great opportunity to meet other parents going through similar experiences and their will be cake!

Do book a place and join me in January.

Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek





Advice and guidance

To find out more, search for health protection in schools or scan the QR code or visit https://qrco.de/minfec.

If your child has had a temperature of **37.8 and or above** they can return to school after they've been **fever- free for 24 hours without antipyretics.**

Antipyretics are medicines such as liquid paracetamol (Calpol) and liquid ibuprofen (Nurofen).
